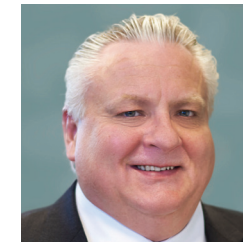

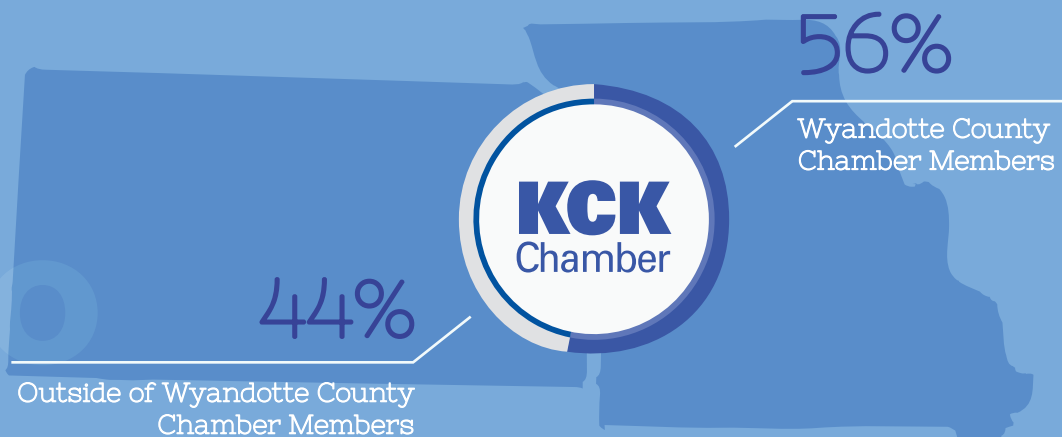

# From our Neighborhoods **UP.**

## Kansas City, Kansas

In line with this year's Annual Meeting theme "Building Equitable Cities" is Mayor David Alvey's "From Our Neighborhood Up" Initiative. The initiative, which Mayor Alvey announced at the 2018 State of the Government, aims to use incremental steps to clean-up neighborhoods, build on vacant lots and improve services to keep established residents and attract new ones.

**“**We must attend more closely to our traditional neighborhoods, because our neighbors deserve a better quality of life and because only by improving the quality of life in our neighborhoods will we grow our tax base,” said Alvey in a recent press release.

According to the Unified Government, building new homes on just 10 percent of the vacant residential lots in older KCK neighborhoods would result in 640 new homes and increase the tax base by an estimated \$96 million.

The Mayor has marked downtown KCK and Strawberry Hill as targeting zones for the initiative. He has stated that the two areas already have many thriving businesses and government offices with room for a lot more development.

A couple of recent development opportunities have brought light to the initiative's objective with the announcement of the University of Kansas Health System, which plans to move hundreds of patients and staff into the long empty EPA building. Also, the Unified Government recently announced an initial agreement with cooperative grocer The Merc to operate a downtown grocery store, a longstanding priority for KCK policymakers.



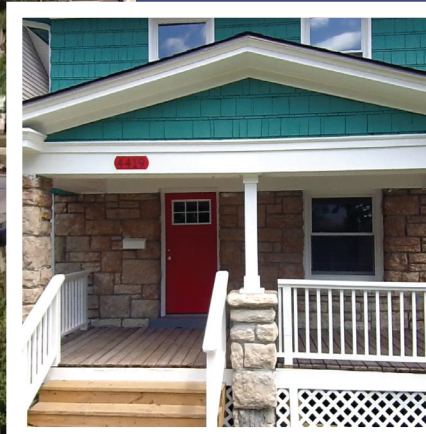
The Mayor said some things can be as simple as engaging with neighbors, beautifying blocks by picking up trash, clearing overgrown brush and planting flowers. He also wants to promote lighting and make streets more walkable.

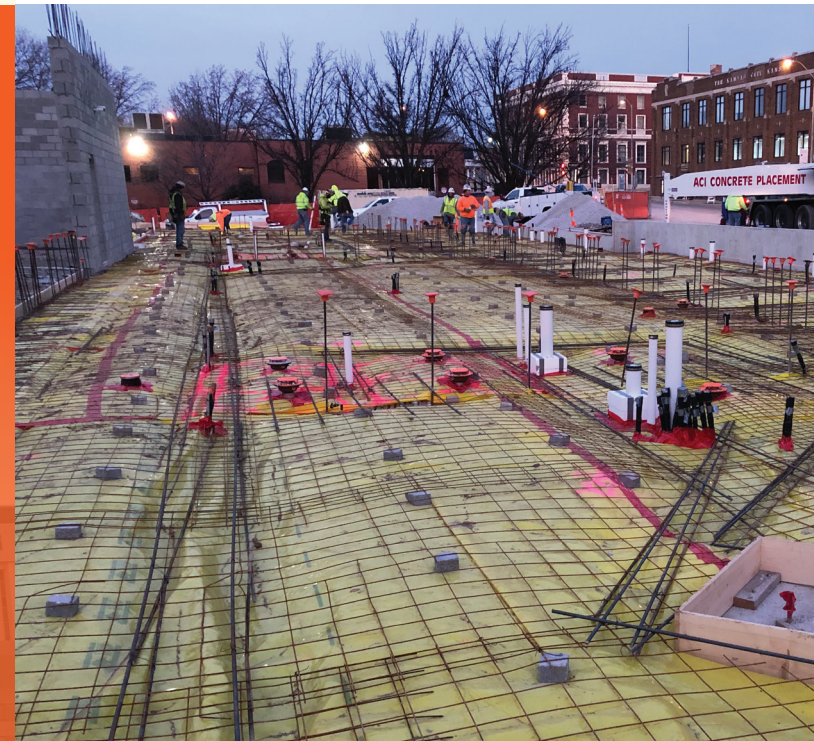
**Q:** WHAT PROJECTS HAVE YOU COMPLETED? WHAT ARE YOU CURRENTLY WORKING ON?

The Unified Government of Wyandotte County/ Kansas City, Kansas held a ceremonial groundbreaking in September 2018 to commemorate the start of construction on the Wyandotte County Juvenile Justice Center, which will be located in the current parking lot behind the Court Services Building on North Seventh Street in Kansas City, Kansas.

Mayor/CEO of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/ Kansas City, Kansas David Alvey opened the ceremony by welcoming guests and offered remarks thanking the community for their support and highlighting how the new \$27.2 million facility will give young people of Wyandotte County a chance to learn from their mistakes.

"The name of our new facility demonstrates our commitment and support for our young people in this community. We are about justice, which holds people accountable but will also provide opportunities for young offenders to get their lives back on track and become positive members of Wyandotte County. This facility will create an environment that will give a much better chance for young people to learn from their mistakes, alter their behavior, and return to their families and community as responsible and productive citizens," Alvey said.

Unified Government officials have been working for nearly a decade to find a better solution for dealing with juvenile offenders and teamed up with architecture firm TreanorHL to help design their vision. Newkirk Novak Construction Partners was then selected as the Construction Manager at Risk on the new construction project to help bring their plan to life.

"We feel privileged to have the opportunity to work with the Unified Government of Wyandotte County and are extremely proud to be a part of this project that is going to help support the continued growth of the Kansas City, Kansas community," said Lynn Newkirk, President of Newkirk Novak Construction Partners.

Currently juvenile and adult offenders are housed in separate areas of the same building, which creates operational challenges and increased costs. Once complete, the 47,000 square-foot Juvenile Justice Center will be utilized solely for juvenile detention, administration and programming.

Work being completed at the three-story facility includes classrooms, a courtyard, detention housing, support spaces, a gymnasium, medical suite, visitation rooms, juvenile intake and assessment space, family courtrooms, and court services offices.

The groundbreaking ceremony came to a close with Wyandotte County Sheriff, Don Ash, who detailed the monumental effort made by city officials to remedy an outdated arrangement and reminded everyone what this project is really about, creating a better tomorrow for today's youth. "I think we have to do better by our young people. We want them to grow up to be productive, contributing members in our society and this facility will certainly give us an opportunity to do a much better job at that than we're currently able to do because of the various restrictions in this outdated facility," said Sheriff Ash. Expected completion for the project is the first quarter of 2020.





Now entering its 51st year, the KCK Chamber's Congressional Forum is the organization's public policy series and longest-standing, most distinguished program. The Forum meets the third Friday of every month and features local, state, and federal representatives to speak about issues relevant to the area's business community.
